SHRINE BOWL COACHES MEET

The 2011 Shrine Bowl coaching staff met with the Shrine Bowl game committee in Fort Mill, SC on Saturday, March 6th. Shrine Bowl Athletic Director, Ron Long, conducted the meeting with several of the game committee chairmen present. This was the first time the coaches had met as a group since their selection in February. North Carolina Head Coach Mark Barnes introduced his staff and South Carolina Head Coach Dave Jordan introduced his staff. The coaches were briefed on the game rules by officials committee co-chairman Danny Martin. Other topics included a discussion about the game week schedule, housing, meals and general administrative matters. Shrine Bowl Administrator, French Harvey discussed the player nomination and selection procedures schedule for next fall. The tentative player selection date was set for October 6th with nominations to be sent in during the period September 1—15. All nominations will go directly to the two head coaches this year instead of to the Shrine Bowl office in Fort Mill, SC. This will be the only time the two coaching staffs will meet with the Shrine Bowl game committee.

Head Coach Mark Barnes

Crest High School, Shelby, NC

Coach Barnes graduated from Trinity High School, Trinity, NC in 1981 and High Point University, High Point, NC in 1985 with a degree in mathematics. He began his coaching career serving as an assistant for 2 years at Northeast Guilford High, Greensboro, NC and then at Richmond Senior High, Rockingham, NC. While serving as an assistant at Richmond they won the 1988 4A State Championship. His first head coaching job was at Reidsville High School, Reidsville, NC from 1989 to 1992. During his three years at Reidsville they compiled a 23-12 record with 3 playoff berths and 1 trip to the 3A state quarter-finals. He left to take the head job at Scotland High School, Laurinburg, NC and coached there from 1992 to 2008. During the 16 years at Scotland they compiled a record of 135-57 and 13 playoff berths. In 2008 he left and took the head job at Brevard High School, Brevard, NC for 2 seasons. His record at Brevard was 12-12 with 2 playoff berths. In 2010 he took the head job at Crest High School in Boiling Springs NC. The first year they went 11-4 and lost in the State 3AA finals. He was an assistant coach in the NC East-West All-Star game in 2001 and the 2001 Shrine Bowl. He also served as the President of the North Carolina Football Coaches Assoc. in 2009. He has been a head coach for 22 years with an overall record of 181 wins and 85 losses with 19 playoff berths.

Head Coach Chuck Jordan

Conway High School, Conway, SC



Coach Jordan graduated Cum Laude from Presbyterian College, Clinton, SC with a degree in mathematics in 1979 and from University of South Carolina, Columbia, SC with a Master's Degree in administration in 1985. He began his coaching career in 1979 as an assistant football coach and teacher at Richland Northeast High School, Columbia, SC. In 1981 he became an assistant varsity football coach and assistant baseball coach at Presbyterian College. He became the head football coach and athletic director at Conway High School in 1983. His overall record at Conway is 243 wins and 107 losses in 28 years. His teams have earned 11 regional championships, had 24 winning seasons, six final four appearances and four times State Runner-up at the State Championships. He has served as 1986 Vice President, SC AAAA Athletic Directors; 1987 President, SC AAAA Athletic Directors; 1994 Assistant Football Coach – North/South All Star Game, Myrtle Beach, SC; 1997 Assistant Football Coach – NCAA Div. II All Star Game (The Snow Bowl), Fargo, ND; 1999 Assistant Football Coach – Shrine Bowl, Charlotte, NC and 2003 Head Football Coach – North/South All Star Game, Myrtle Beach, SC His honors include: 1984, 1985, 1986, 1991, 1995, 1996, 2000, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2008. – Region V/VI-AAAA Coach of the Year; 1995 South Carolina AAAA Coach of the Year 2002 Carolina Panthers North Carolina/South Carolina Coach of the Year – Criteria was Community Involvement and 2006 AAAA Lower State Coach of the Year

Bowl Week Photographer Volunteers at Shriners Hospitals

Shrine Bowl photographer Stan Seigle captures moments from Shrine Bowl Week of 2010. He has been a Shriner since 1972 and is a passionate volunteer. He first joined a Cincinnati Shrine Club where he served as the director of the photo unit. Seigle served in that position for twenty-one years. Seigle has a great love for all the Shriner's charitable causes and for photography.

"It's the love of my life," says Seigle about his work as a photographer. He has worked as a commercial advertising photographer and later as an aerial photographer for the United States Navy.

After joining the Shrine club, Seigle became involved with the Shriners Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio where he serves as a road runner. Road runners are the volunteers who transport patients to and from different Shriners Hospitals in the United States. Being a road runner is not the only way Seigle volunteers. He also works in the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital as a tour guide, he picks up patients at the airport, and he even sorts mail and shreds papers.

"It's a lot of fun at times, but there are days that we go in and never know...what we'll be doing," Seigle says of volunteering at the hospital. Even though he may be uncertain of what the hospital needs, Seigle is always willing to help in anyway he can.

The Cincinnati Shriners Hospital has two hundred volunteers, proving that Shriners are passionate about helping the patients. Some Shriners bring in their dogs for the patients to play with. Others clean the fish tanks that make the hospital more fun and lively.

Stan Seigle volunteers multiple times each week, sometimes up to five days in a row. He has dedicated his time as one of the Shrine Bowl photographers for almost sixteen years now.

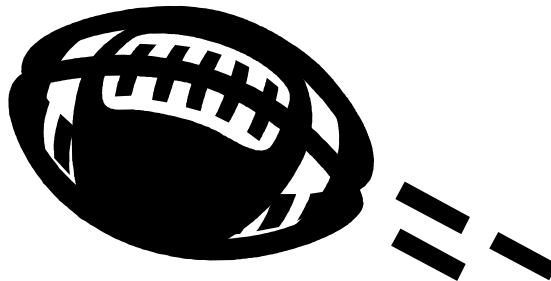
Twitter is a social networking system using 140 characters or less per “tweet” or post. Currently there are more than 145 million registered users on Twitter. It took Twitter three years, two months and one day to reach the first billion tweets. Now there are about a billion tweets a week throughout the world. You can sign up to follow the people you want to keep up with each day. We hope you will decide to join the Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas as we try to keep you up to date with all that is going on.

The Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas started using Twitter during last year’s game week to keep fans up to date. Our page address is <http://twitter.com/shrinebowlncsc> . You can keep up with things on your computer from there. You may also go to <http://twitter.com> and sign up for an account of your own and become a follower of the ShrineBowlNCSC.
